### **Introduction**

Blanton-Peale Institute provides psychoanalytic training to qualified individuals interested in becoming licensed psychoanalysts. The program is registered with the State of New York and prepares residents to sit for the NY State licensing exam in psychoanalysis. Additionally, it provides a certificate in psychoanalysis for any qualified person in the mental health field.

Our program is a uniquely multicultural community that offers integration of psychoanalysis with spirituality, has a solid grounding in Freudian and Jungian theories and their contemporary manifestations and offers opportunity for clinical experience in an outpatient mental health clinic with a wide range of patients. ### **Summary of Position**

The Director of the Psychoanalytic Training Program of Blanton-Peale is responsible for the complete oversight of a premiere institute training in psychoanalysis. The Director is responsible for the supervision of a Program Administrator and the various aspects of program development that emphasizes multicultural community and the incorporation of spirituality as a Blanton-Peale distinctive.

### **Responsibilities Include:**

1. Oversight of Training Program with attention to curriculum progression and course preparing, faculty recruitment, streamlined admissions process and mentoring residents as they progress throughout the program.
2. Assure Program remains in compliance with NYS regulations and in compliance with ABAP standards for accreditation.
3. Supervision and guidance of Program Administrator, Faculty, and Training committees.

4. Develop and Implement evaluation system for faculty, supervisors and residents.
5. Serve as liaison between Blanton-Peale entities- clinic administration, senior staff as necessary as well as between residents, faculty and supervisors.
6. Interface with psychoanalytic community- other institutes, psychoanalytic bodies such as the American Board for Accreditation in Psychoanalysis (ABAP), the National Association for the Advancement of Psychoanalysis (NAAP).
7. Develop program materials that clearly delineate program offerings, expectations and responsibilities of residents, faculty and supervisors.
8. Represent the value of psychoanalysis with Blanton-Peale as well as within the larger community

- Holds a certificate in psychoanalysis from a recognized psychoanalytic institute, and holds a New York State license in mental health that includes psychoanalysis in the scope of practice
